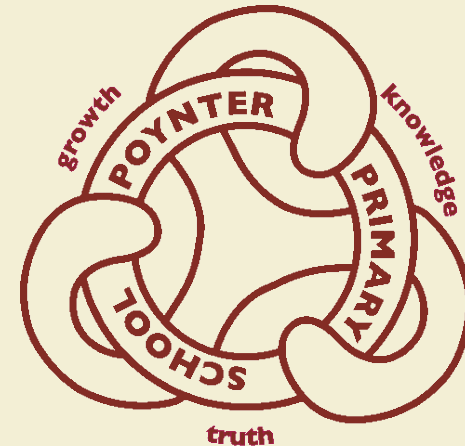

THE SCHOOL UNIFORM

The School Board determines, in consultation with students, their parents and staff of the school, a dress code for students when they are attending or representing the school.

At the primary school level a dress code entails a school uniform and clothing standards to cover the range of activities undertaken in a primary program.

There is an agreed expectation from the school community and staff that all children (Kindergarten to Year 6) will wear the school uniform.

Clothing

- Everyday polo shirt – As per design, pale blue / maroon / ink navy, with school logo.
- Skirt, with inbuilt shorts / bike pants – Maroon (if sourced outside Uniform Shop, colour must match school zip jacket).
- Shorts – Maroon – (above knee) (if sourced outside Uniform Shop, colour must match school zip jacket).
- Track Jackets – Maroon – Fleece windcheater with zip and school logo.
- Track Pants – Maroon – Fleece (if sourced outside Uniform Shop, colour must match school zip jacket).
- Jazz / Active Pants – Maroon (if sourced outside Uniform Shop, colour must match school zip jacket).
- Dress – Poynter blue check dress (can only be sourced from Uniform Shop) (**summer only– no skivvy underneath**)
- Rain Jacket – Maroon - Water resistant with school logo (**winter only**)
- Sports Polo – House colours with school logo, red, gold, blue or green.
- Stockings - Maroon stockings only

School Bag

- Optional – Blue school bag with white logo available at Uniform Shop.

Footwear

- Closed in shoes and socks – **no** thongs / beach sandals. No fashion shoes.
- Kindergarten and Pre-primary students may wear sturdy sandals. No fashion shoes.

Headwear

- The school broad brimmed hat with school logo.

Hair Length

- Shoulder length hair, or longer, must be tied back. Hair should be clipped back off the face.

Jewellery

- The wearing of jewellery is discouraged, watch and studs/sleepers are acceptable.

Make-Up

Exemption

- An exemption may be granted by the Principal based on: unavailability of an item; health; religious beliefs; a matter relating to the student's cultural background; and or any other matter which in the Principal's opinion is sufficient to exempt the student from complying.

Non Compliance

- Students will be encouraged at every opportunity to comply with the School Dress Code.
- Parents will be contacted and encouraged to support the school dress code in writing.
- A student may be denied the opportunity to participate in excursions or represent the school.
- Students in some circumstances may be required to change into a loaned uniform.

School Dress Advisory Panel

- A school sub-committee of the School Board will be set up with the specific role of providing assistance and support in relation to compliance with the school dress code.
