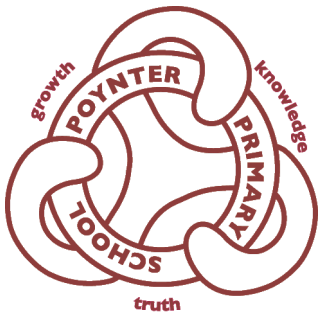




STUDENT LEADERSHIP POLICY 2026

At Poynter Primary School we value and respect student voice. Our vision and values encourage students to contribute to the provision of a caring, safe, and inclusive environment for all.

Our student leadership program fosters the participation and leadership skills of active and reflective listening, clear and effective communication, critical and creative thinking, goal setting and action planning, mediation and dispute resolution, and problem solving and decision making.

All prospective Year 6 students are given the opportunity to nominate for a formal student leadership position.

Key Principles of Student Leadership a Poynter

- All students have the potential to develop leadership skills over time.
- All students have the right to develop and demonstrate leadership skills.
- The student leadership program will be more sustainable if it is supported by students, parents, teachers, the school and the local community.
- A range of student leadership styles will be identified and promoted.
- Leadership opportunities will be non-discriminatory.
- Leadership roles will be perceived as valued by the students and the school.
- Students' leadership skills, knowledge and attitude will be encouraged and developed through a range of school programs and events.
- Students will apply their leadership skills to initiatives which strengthen the school community.
- Leadership is important for building students' awareness that their views are important and student voice is sought and listened to.
- Leaders are expected to set an example for fellow students, demonstrate exemplary work ethic, promote a positive school environment and maintain an attitude of respect for fellow students, staff and community members.
- Leaders are expected to demonstrate civic, social and moral responsibility and be productive members of the Poynter community.



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Application and Selection Process

Students are able to select any leadership positions they would like to nominate for. They will only be able to fulfill one leadership position. The nomination process will be run in Term 4, the year prior to the students entering Year 6. Students nominating to be a Student Councillor will present a speech to their peers and staff prior to electoral voting. If a nominated student is absent on the day of speeches they are still eligible for election, however; pre-recorded speeches will not be presented as this does not meet the same public speaking requirement of the live speaking process. Specialist teachers will run a separate application process for their captains towards the conclusion of Term 4. Library Monitors, Audio Visual Crew and Telethon Ambassadors will be selected Semester 1 of Year 6.

Self Confidence You need to know your own abilities and not be afraid to bring them to bear in your leadership role. Fellow students should admire you for your personality, character and the things that you contribute to the school.
